A Gripping Psychological Thriller

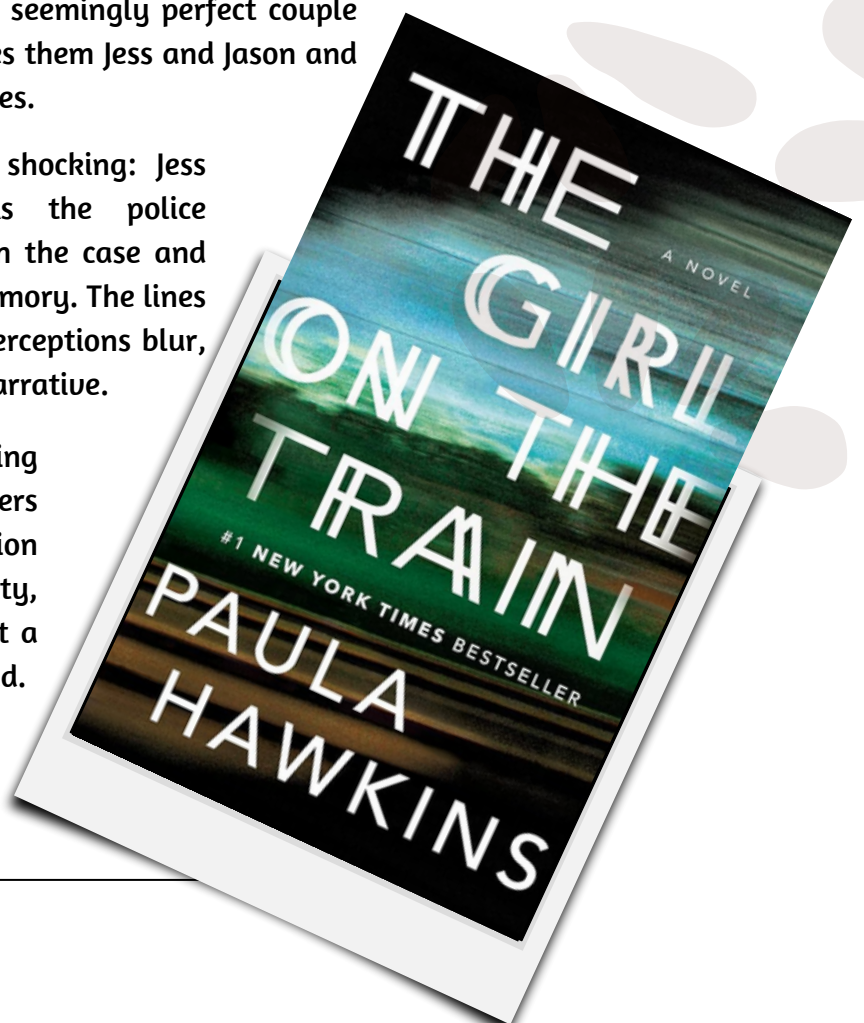

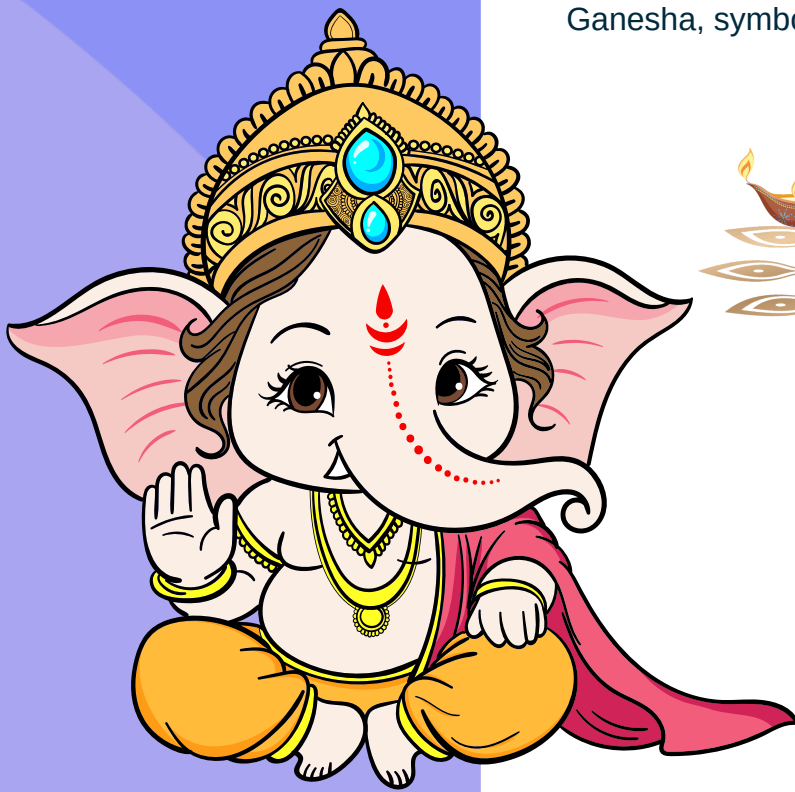

The Vamana form of Lord Vishnu is worshipped on this day with full devotion. Devotees observe a fast to attain happiness and peace.





GANESH CHATURTHI

7th September 2024, celebrated as Ganesh Chaturthi, is a significant Hindu festival, also known as Vinayak Chaturthior Ganeshotsav. The day marks the birth anniversary of Lord Ganesha, symbolizing wisdom and good fortune.



It is celebrated in various ways, such as bringing small clay or eco-friendly idols of Lord Ganesha into homes, decorating houses, offering food and flowers, and reciting prayers and mantras. In public places, large idols are placed throughout the city, and people participate in singing and dancing.



Usually, 10 days after Chaturthi, Ganpati Visarjan is performed, during which the idols of Lord Ganesha are immersed in water. Some people also observe fasting during this period. Prasad (food blessed by the deity) is distributed within the community.



World Suicide Prevention Day

World Suicide Prevention Day (WSPD) is an awareness day observed every year on 10th September to promote worldwide commitment and action to prevent suicides, with various activities taking place globally. Since 2003, the International Association for Suicide Prevention (IASP) has collaborated with the World Health Organization (WHO) and the World Federation for Mental Health (WFMH) to host World Suicide Prevention Day. In 2011, an estimated 40 countries held awareness events to mark the occasion.

The triennial theme for World Suicide Prevention Day 2024-2026 is "Changing the Narrative on Suicide," with the call to action being "Start the Conversation." This theme aims to raise awareness about the importance of reducing stigma and encouraging open conversations to prevent suicides.

Yellow and orange are the two colors used to signify suicide prevention awareness globally. The main purpose of World Suicide Prevention Day is to shift public perception, spread hope, and share vital information with people affected by suicide. POLA

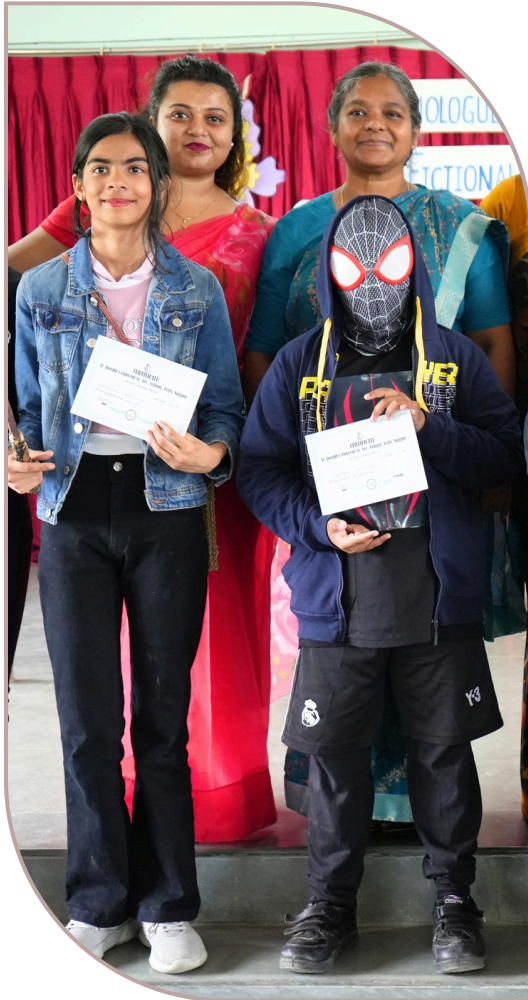

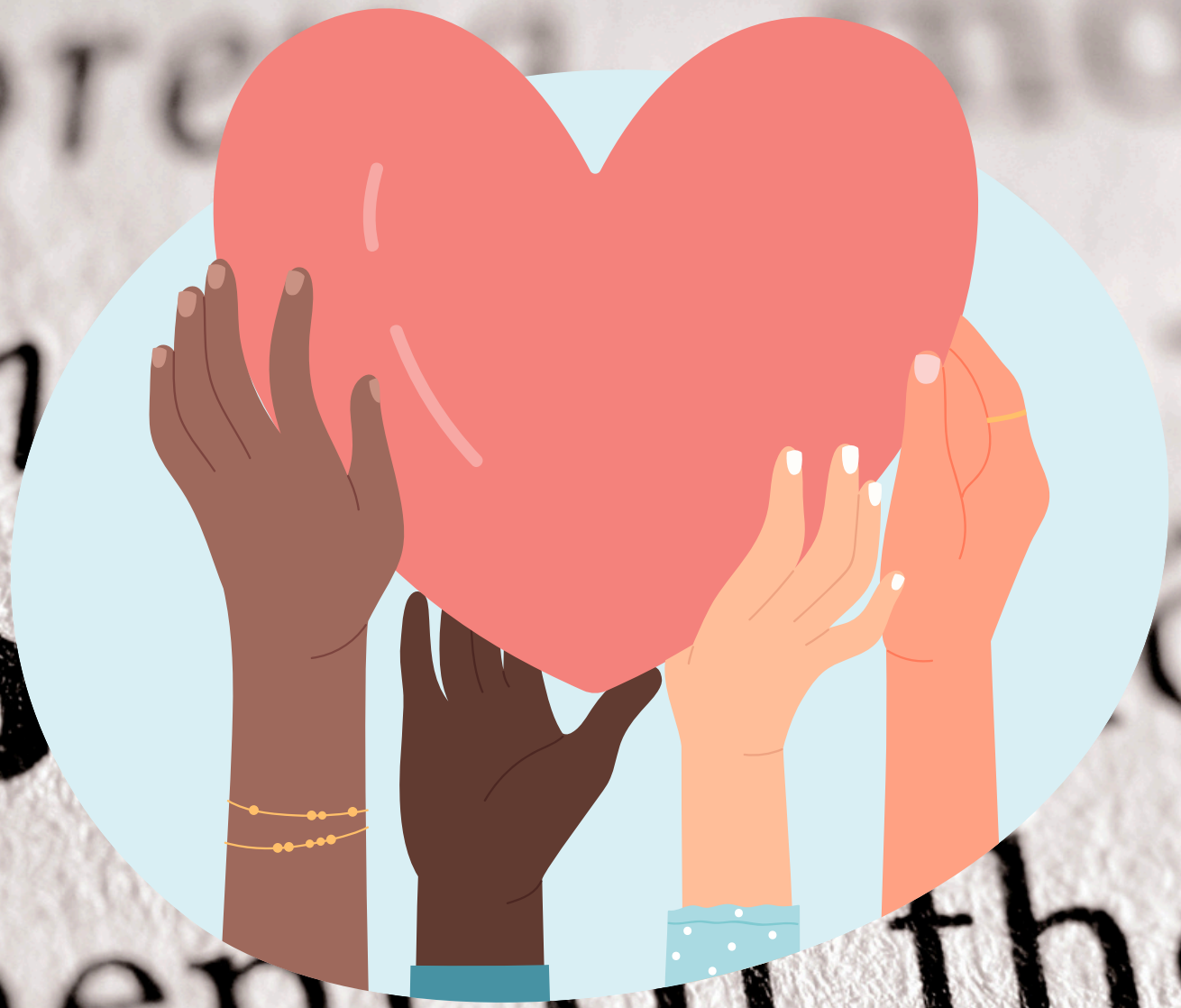
